In the evening the Alumni of the school are also organising a dinner, so the weekend should be an excellent opportunity to celebrate the history of Olashore International School. The events on Saturday mean that our Founder's Day Athletics programme will take place in the stadium on Sunday morning following religious services, I hope as many parents as possible are able to join us and we can make it a great day for the children to display their talents.

## Students' Result

## Year 12 IGCSE Result

IGCSE results will be released on Thursday 17<sup>th</sup> January, 2019. Students who took the IGCSE examination did not take the Term 1 Examination. When their results are released, it will be mailed to parents and copies will be given to the students.

## Year 12 Mock Examination

Externally moderated Mock Examination (WASSCE) will start on Monday 21<sup>st</sup> January, 2019. Results will be available on the Second Visiting Day of Term 2.

## Year 12 JAMB, WAEC, SAT and IELTS Registration

Registration of Year 12 students for these examinations have commenced. A form is sent home with the students for parents to confirm the entry details for these examinations. The form should be submitted at the senior master's table during the term 2 resumption exercise. Correction on the entries will not be feasible after term 2 resumption (January 13<sup>th</sup> 2019).

## IELTS Tests

This is to inform parents that IELTS UK-VI and IELTS standard tests have been scheduled for Thursday 23<sup>rd</sup> May, 2019.

## College Board SAT Tests

This is to inform parents that registration for March 9 SAT / SAT with Essay will close on December 31<sup>st</sup> 2018. Parents are reminded that the original international passport of their child is the only valid means of registration and identification for the tests.

### Work Experience

During the Easter vacation all Year 11 students are expected to take part in a two-week work experience programme. The aim of the programme is to provide students with the opportunity to gain experience of the world of work. This experience can prove useful in gaining university entrance and scholarships as well as future employment.

If possible, we would like parents to secure a slot for their child and inform the school of the company he/she will be undertaking his/her work experience programme with on resumption.

### Year 10 and 11 Trip to France

Year 10 and 11 Students will be going to France in April, 2019. A letter containing items needed for the trip is enclosed in an envelope to be taken home by all Year 10 and 11 students who have registered for the excursion. Parents who have registered their child/ ward for the trip are expected to submit all documents as listed below on resumption day Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> and Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> January, 2019. A table will be set-up in the school hall for this purpose.

the visa application form and the medical forms are filled and returned to school on resumption.

### School Clinic

Parents are kindly reminded to ensure that whatever medication their wards return to school with is duly handed over to the school doctor.

Parents are also advised to update the health information on their wards. This will include newly diagnosed conditions, recent surgeries or updates on pre-existing medical conditions. The information provided will aid in ensuring adequate follow up/care for the student while in school.

### Dress Code at Resumption

On resumption, all students are expected to wear low hair and be dressed in their school uniforms and shoes. Students are not permitted to do the following; wear hair extensions, be clad in their house wear or wear crocs. Kindly note that students who are inappropriately attired and groomed will not be checked in.

### Clippers

Male students are expected to have their own personal clippers and shavers. In an attempt to avoid having regular haircuts, some of our male students deliberately do not bring their clippers to school, so we would be most grateful if parents could make it a point of duty to ensure that their wards come to school with clippers.

### Footwear and Bracelets

It important to note that students are only permitted to wear black sandals and "crocs" with their house wear. Under no circumstances are students allowed to wear contrary footwear, particularly when they are leaving the hostels for the school area. Parents should endeavor to provide their children with the recommended footwear.



### **Sports**

Students should come with following equipment for soccer and badminton:

- Shin guards
- Soccer boots
- Ankle guards
- Badminton racquet
- Soccer Socks
- Trainers

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### **Jumpers**

We deem it necessary to reiterate the school policy on appropriate jumpers. Students can wear plain white, grey or black jumpers ONLY. Kindly bear in mind that hooded jumpers are not allowed.

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### **Bedding**

It has come to our notice that some of our students have just one set of bedding. When this is taken to laundry they are left without proper bedding until it is returned.

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We will appreciate it if parents could provide their wards with at least two sets of bedding.

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### **Nail Cutters**

Since students are expected to keep short nails, it would be worthwhile to provide them with appropriate nail cutters. We do not allow our students to cut their nails with razor blades.

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### **End of Term Luggage**

We will like to suggest that at the end of each term students should go home with at most two luggage. We assure you that students personal effects left in school will be safe.

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### **Birthday Celebrations**

Parents who are interested in celebrating their child's birthday should pay a maximum of twenty thousand naira (N20,000) into the school account at least a week before the birthday. The school will get the necessary items for the birthday. Under no circumstances should parents bring birthday items to school for their children. As much as possible we want to discourage rivalry among the students.
