Happy New Year and welcome to the second term of this academic session. As I write this newsletter.

we are celebrating an auspicious anniversary as it was 25 years ago today (Monday 10th January 1994) that the first set of students began lessons here at Olashore International School. The opening of the school had originally been planned for September 1993 but had to be delayed due to challenges faced regarding the supply of water and other utilities. It is a credit to the parents of those pioneer students that they were prepared to exercise patience as they had the confidence that Olashore International School would offer an education that was unparalleled in Nigeria. It is obvious now that they made the right choice. In recent times we have seen how those pioneer students, based on the strong foundation laid through their six years at OIS, have gone on to be outstanding leaders across Nigeria. The pioneer Head Girl was the first female logistics manager at Maersk in Nigeria, breaking the glass ceiling and showing that there are no boundaries that can't be broken. Another pioneer student, Olanipekun, the Guest Speaker at our Speech and Prize Giving Day is the youngest Senior Advocate of Nigeria, showing that youth is not a barrier to any achievement, and he encouraged current OIS students to set their goals high.

Throughout this year we have been hosting events in school and across the country to showcase the talents of Olashore students past and present. Last term the school drama troupe performed in Abuja, Ibadan, and Lagos and this term they will also perform in Akure. We also look forward this term to the school debate team participating in the COBIS World Student Debate in Bucharest, Romania. This will be an

opportunity to demonstrate our students' outstanding debate skills on a world stage following consistent success here in Nigeria. Last term also saw students participate international competitions online and I would like congratulate students who achieved certificates of merit in the COBIS maths competition as well as the Year 7 students who completed the World Economic Forum Digital Quotient (DQ World) challenge. I would also like to congratulate Mr. Salami, who led the DQ World programme in school. Based on the success of the programme at Olashore he is one of only 20 teachers globally to reach the semifinals of the DQ Teacher Challenge. The final judging will take place this term and we wish him success as he vies to become the Top DQ Teacher for 2018.

During this term, the Chairman and I will again be visiting locations around Nigeria and the U.K. to meet parents and prospective parents to share the success of the school and the benefits of an Olashore education. The details of the events are included in the newsletter and I hope as many of you as possible will be able to attend and bring along friends who are interested in finding out more about the school.

Finally, I would like to invite all parents to the 25th Anniversary Founder's Day Celebration on Saturday 9th February. This will be the major celebration of the school's history and we look forward to welcoming high_profile guests including the Governors of Osun State and Ekiti State. It will be a chance to celebrate alumni and current students along with staff who have served the school throughout its 25 years.

School Fees

The Term 2 fees are due for payment on or before Saturday, 12th January 2019 when the school will resume for the 2nd term. Parents are to pay their ward(s) fees in full, as management and staff are not allowed to sign any undertaking for fee deferment or part payment.

In order to fast track the clearance process, parents are to pay their ward(s) fee on or before Thursday 10th January 2019.

RESUMPTION PROCEDURES

REGISTRATION OF RETURNING STUDENTS

Arrival and Registration of students will take place between: 8:30am – 6.00pm

(No student/parent will be attended to after 6.00pm)

Refreshments will be available for parents in the School Hall

PROCEDURES AT THE MAIN GATE

- All vehicles must stop at the gate.
- Everybody except the driver should alight and go to the reception to wash their hands. Thereafter, they should proceed to the school hall.
- All drivers should wash their hands at the designated point at the gate.
- Thereafter they should drive their vehicles to the car park.

Please follow the instructions of security staff at all times to ensure safety of students.

ALL REGISTRATION ACTIVITIES WILL TAKE PLACE IN THE SCHOOL HALL Please note that registration will be in the following sequence: Points 1-6 will be in the Gallery

POINT 1. Bursary/Accounts Registration

- Parents will need to provide evidence of payment, such as school issued receipts and tellers.
- On receipt of evidence of payment, clearance will be given to parents so that they can proceed with the other resumption activities

POINT 2. ID card for Parents/Eduportal Updates

- Parents that need ID cards will have their photographs and details taken for production of ID cards.
- Parents having difficulty accessing the Eduportal can meet concerned staff members here.
- Parents should collect their ID cards before going downstairs.

POINT 3. Student's Registration with the Senior Master

The following items will be required at this point:

- Year 9 students will be able to submit their tentative subject selection form here.
- Year 12 students will submit their External Examination Confirmation Form.
- All students will register and check their classes here.











POINT 4. Students' Registration with the Registrar

- Photograph and image authorisation forms should be submitted here.
- Refundable deposit form to be submitted here.

POINT 5. Religious Affairs

- Enquiries about confirmation, Baptism and Catechism would be attended to here.
- All other questions and enquiries on religious activities would be attended to here.

POINT 6. Clinic registration with Medical Staff

Returning students should submit:

- Any medication brought from home, which will be handed over to the clinic personnel.
- Any other relevant medical information which will be recorded by clinic personnel.

Points 7 – 11 will take place in the Main Hall

POINT 7. School Excursion

- All necessary excursion documentation will be submitted here.
- Enquiries about all school excursions will be attended to here.

POINT 8. Leadership

- All year 10 students will submit the details of the companies they wish to work in during the Easter holidays.
- Year 10 students will submit community service consent forms here.
- Enquiries concerning Leadership activities would be attended to here.

POINT 9. Information Desk

- Information on open events and entrance exams can be sought here.
- Enquires and findings concerning 2019/2020 admission can be sought here.

POINT 10. Release and Departure

- Clearance form will be signed by a member of staff and returned to parents as the students pass through to the checking area.
- Students should collect their luggage and pass through the entry to the checking area.
- Parents are not allowed to enter the checking area.
- Students will not be permitted to exit the checking area once they have been checked in.
- Parents may leave school as soon as their children have gone to check their luggage.
- Parents should submit clearance form to the security personnel at the School Gate when leaving the school.

POINT 11. Refreshment

POINT 12. Registration of Musical Instruments

- Students will complete the musical instrument registration form.
- The state of the musical instrument will be determined and documented if necessary.
- Students' names will be written on their musical instruments.
- The musical instrument will be collected by the coordinator.

POINT 13. Laptop Hard and flash drive Registration / Submission of iPads

- Students will complete the laptop registration form; the state of the laptop will be ascertained and recorded.
- A staff member will check to ensure the name of the student is inscribed on the laptop.
- Laptops and flash drives will be collected by an ICT staff member for assessment.
- Year 7 and 8 iPads will be submitted.
 - Please note that years 7, 8 and 9 are not permitted to bring laptops.

POINT 14. Check-In of students by House Staff

- Only students who are dressed in their school uniforms would be attended to here.
- The students' hairstyle will be checked. Students with inappropriate hairstyles will be attended to immediately.
- Students' luggage and items will be meticulously checked.
- Any contraband items will be confiscated, labelled and documented.
- Students' luggage will be appropriately labelled and transported to the hostels.

Please ensure that your child does not have any items which are not permitted in the school in their bags. These items will be confiscated and delay the checking process for all students.
